Learning and teaching is designed around the eight curricular areas of the Curriculum for Excellence. This term, our foci include...



Literacy and English

P3 will be continuing to use the *Oxford Reading Tree* books to improve fluency.

We will also be exploring the novel *The* Magic Finger by Roald Dahl, undertaking various activities using the Super Six reading strategies to increase comprehension.

Writing will be based around recounts and fiction, where we will use Writer's Craft to develop our skills.

We will be concentrating on using adjectives to add interest to our work, and self-editing our spelling and punctuation

Oracy will be developed through preparation for our Pirates class assembly.

Numeracy and mathematics

In *Number*, we will be looking at the 2 and 4 times tables, and the 3 and 6 times tables, and exploring the link between multiplying and division.

In Beyond number we will be looking at simple factions, and starting work on time (o'clock, half past, and quarter past / to).

Expressive arts

In art and design this term will be we doing junk modeling, line drawings and printing.

Our drama and music will primarily revolve around preparations for our end-of-topic Pirates assembly

We will also be learning Christmas songs, and looking at expression and feeling.

This term, the PE focus will be gymnastics and working together in pairs / teams.
