Learning and teaching is designed around the eight curricular areas of the *Curriculum for Excellence*. This term, our foci include...



Literacy and English

While we will begin to use the *Literacy World* scheme to help with our reading this term, we will also be studying *The Worst Witch* by Jill Murphy. We will continue to use the *Super Six* reading strategies.

In Big Writing we will be focusing on imaginative writing and working at improving openers in our sentences.

We will be using a variety of written and active strategies in class and at home to enhance our spelling skills.

Numeracy and mathematics

We will be focusing on the importance of place value in numeracy work. We will be learning to round numbers to the nearest ten and hundred. We will continue to practice addition and subtraction skills.

In *Beyond Number* we will be working on estimation and measurement this term.

Expressive arts

In art this term we will be working on drawing portraits and creating collages.

In music we will be appraising pieces of music from a variety of genres.

Science

We will be studying the water cycle this term. We will be making links between the water cycle, weather and climate.

Health and wellbeing

During the first part of this term, we focussed on firework safety lessons.
