Bear Takes a Trip by Stella **Blackstone**

Children can practise telling the time by following Bear and his friend on their trip to the mountains. Brightly coloured illustrations and rhyming text.

Copycat by Mark Birchall

Whatever Dog does, Cat wants to do too, and it's only when Cat goes away that Dog realises how much she misses him. A relatable situation for children with siblings with a good twist at the end.

Dear Zoo by Rod Campbell

As you lift the flaps in search of an ideal pet, a host of different zoo animals will be revealed, until the right pet is finally discovered. Lots of chances for joining in with animal noises and the "I sent him back" phrase.

Dirty Bertie by David Roberts

Bertie has shockingly dirty habits from nose picking to eating dog food! Children will laugh out loud at the hilarious illustrations and will love joining in with the repetitive chorus.

Doing the Animal Bop by Jan **Ormerod & Lindsey Gardiner**

Rhythm, repetition and a relatable story make this the perfect book to read aloud. There are lots of swishy swashy actions and sound effects to join in with!

Where's Spot by Eric Hill

A great picture book with liftthe-flap pages where children can make animal noises and join in with the story. Clear and cute illustrations; children have fun finding Spot again and again!








