<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Silly Sentences</u></p> <p>Write silly sentences using a spelling word in each sentence. Please underline your spelling words and use good description.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Roll a Word</u></p> <p>Roll a ball back and forth with a partner. You say the 1<sup>st</sup> letter and then roll and your partner says 2<sup>nd</sup> letter, and so on.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Ransom Spelling</u></p> <p>Cut letters out of newspapers and magazines to spell out your words and stick them down.</p>
<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Rainbow Writing</u></p> <p>Write your spelling words out using coloured pencils or felt tip pens and use a different colour for each letter.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Hide and Seek</u></p> <p>Get your partner to choose some letter cards that spell a word and hide them round the room. Find the cards and put them in the correct order to spell the word. Swap over.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><u>1 Minute Challenge</u></p> <p>Write your word as many times as you can in 1 minute and then challenge your partner to do the same.</p>
<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Mystery Words</u></p> <p>Take turns spelling out the words using a finger on your partner's back and guess what the word is.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Sing and Spell</u></p> <p>Make up a song or rap to help you remember your spelling words. You might want to share this with your class.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Different Ways</u></p> <p>Write your spelling words in different ways e.g. really big, really small, bubble writing etc.</p>
