What do we want to do?

Our children will be more engaged, supported and challenged in Numeracy and Mathematics.

How will we achieve this?

- Numeracy Progression Pathways: Our children and young people will be able to demonstrate improved attainment in numeracy from prior levels in learning using clear skills progression.
- <u>Staff Development</u> workshops on the use of Concrete, <u>Pictorial</u>, <u>Abstract approaches</u> in addition, subtraction, multiplication, division; fractions, percentages and decimals calculations and in using the <u>Bar Model</u> to visualise problems and Number Talks to start lessons.
- <u>Family Engagement:</u> We will increase family engagement in our numeracy program through increased workshop attendance, evaluations/questionnaires and parent information leaflets in **Playalong Maths (**Nursery to Pr. 1) Families Connect and Glasgow Counts workshops
- <u>Staff Training:</u> Our children will benefit from using highly motivational digital tools to enhance the learning and teaching of Numeracy and/or Mathematics (Sumdog, iPad, maths games)
- <u>Growth Mindset:</u> Promote the use of Growth Mindset in numeracy to promote a 'can do' attitude to maths.
- Our children will benefit from improvements in learning and teaching pedagogy and practice in numeracy and mathematics through focusing on:
- ullet Children understanding Learning Intentions
- ♦ Children helping to create Success Criteria
- ♦ Quality questioning and Effective Feedback.

Health and Wellbeing

What do we want to do?

We aim to promote improved health and wellbeing of all pupils by further developing Resilience, Growth Mindset, Children's Rights, Pupil Voice and Outdoor Learning.

- <u>Action for Children:</u> Our children will be able to participate in group workshops on building relationships, self esteem and confidence building, change and loss, and bereavement.
- <u>Staff training:</u> Staff will receive further training in nurturing principles, Restorative Approaches, Promoting Positive Relationships and Resilience building to support all pupils.
- <u>Family Engagement in Healthy Cooking:</u> Through free 'Big Cook Little Cook' and 'Big Cook Little Learner' cookery workshops. (nursery-P7)
- <u>Children's Rights:</u> To further develop Children's Rights (Nursery to P7) including developing Leadership in pupils through Pupil Groups, and to work towards Recognition of Commitment UNCRC.
- <u>Outdoor Learning</u>: Including growing, planting, harvesting and cooking. To work towards Acorn Award, John Muir, 3rd Green Flag, Paddle Award and bushcraft skills, P6 Clyde in the Classroom, Forest Schools and Cycle Friendly School awards promoting Learning for Sustainability.
- New Bounceback and Growth Mindset: Continue with the explicit teaching of resilience and Growth Mindsets. Children will learn to 'bounce back' when they experience setbacks.

Priority 1

CfE - Achieving Literacy and English What do we want to do?

- Our children will be more engaged, supported and challenged in reading, writing, talking and listening.
- <u>Staff development:</u> we will upskill staff in the highest quality of teaching of Reading, Talking and Listening and Writing Strategies including spelling.
- Improve attainment in reading:
- We shall ensure a 'Reading Spine' for each class, from nursery—P7. This is a programme of high quality fiction for children to practise their reading into writing skills and strategies. These is a wide collection of the highest quality children's fiction including Michael Morpurgo, Ted Hughes, Roald Dahl, Julia Donaldson, Philip Pullman, C.S. Lewis etc.
- We shall include author and illustrator visits and focus on Reading for Enjoyment including Dunard Reading Challenge.
- We shall extend our school lending library and train Junior Librarians to run this.
- We have organised our Library using book banding and an Accelerated Reading Programme to support and challenge individual reading comprehension.
- We shall support <u>Family engagement</u> in reading and writing through the promotion of workshop attendance in <u>Storysack and Playing with Sounds</u>, <u>Families Connect</u> and Parent Reading and Writing workshops.
- <u>Paired Reading:</u> Some children will participate in 'Scotland Reads' a paired reading program.
- <u>Read</u>, <u>Write</u>, <u>Inc</u>: Some children will participate in Read, Write, Inc. workshops to further raise standards in reading, comprehension and writing.
- <u>Further Improve Attainment in Writing</u>: We shall pilot and further develop 'Talk4Writing' program from nursery to P7 to raise attainment in writing.
- We shall further develop Reading and Talking and Listening through <u>Reciprocal Reading/Literacy</u> Circles.
